

#### Library Board Selects Bloomfield Township Public Library Director

The Bloomfield Township Public Library Board of Trustees announced at their June 18, 2013 meeting that Carol Mueller has been selected as the next Library Director. Carol assumed her new role effective August 1, 2013.

Library Board President, Judy Lindstrom said, "After discussion, it was unanimously agreed to offer the position of Library Director to Carol Mueller. The Trustees felt Carol was an extremely strong, competent and enthusiastic candidate. Carol is familiar with the Library and community and has worked well with the Library Board of Trustees, Friends of the Library and Library Staff. The Trustees were impressed with her style of management and technologic interests and believe Carol will be an excellent Director for the Library. The Trustees felt Carol would allow for a smooth transition, which is critical to the Library moving forward after the departure of Karen Kotulis-Carter, who has been an outstanding Director. "

Patrons may already know Carol Mueller as the Library's Assistant Director, a position she has held since October, 2008. In her position as Assistant Director, Carol coordinated the strategic planning process, implemented a new brand for the Library and assisted with the redesign of the Library's website, among other projects. Prior to joining Bloomfield Township Public Library in 2008, Carol held the position of Deputy City Librarian at the Southfield Public Library for many years. In this capacity, her focus was on overseeing the day to day library operation including staff and building.

To renew only specific items, click on the box to the left of any item you wish to renew, then click Renew Selected. Select "Yes" to proceed with renewals, scroll down and verify that each item you wished to renew shows a new due date. If an item is not renewable, it will say "Not all renewals were successful. See details below." Next to each item will be a reason as to why it has not been renewed. We recommend printing this page for your records.



The leaves are falling so it's time for you to fall in love with one of the autumn titles.

Adult: Autumn in the Heavenly Kingdom: China, the West, and the Epic Story of the Taiping Civil War by Stephen R. Platt — A gripping account of China's nineteenth-century Taiping Rebellion, one of the largest civil wars in history.

Teen: *Miki Falls (Autumn)* — In this graphic novel it's autumn and Miki Yoshida's life is finally settling into a routine. She and Hiro are spending all their time together, and Miki couldn't be happier. There's just one problem. Hiro's breaking all the rules to be with Miki, and the more time they spend together-and the more they fall for each other-the more there is at stake. With jealous Reika on the prowl, Miki knows they can't hide forever.
