Freezing a hold retains your position in the hold queue while you are away. To freeze a hold, go to our website, www.btpl.org, and click on "My Account" at the top of the page. Type your full name and your library card number and click on Submit. At the top of the page, click on the link that says "requests (holds)." You will see all the items you currently have on hold. To freeze a hold, click on the small box to the right of an item. A checkmark will appear in this box indicating that the hold has been frozen for you. Don't forget to come back and click on the small box again to un-freeze your hold once you return from your vacation.

Since opening its doors on October 20, 1964, the Library has become a cornerstone in Bloomfield Township. Sunday, January 26 at 4:00 p.m. Held at the DeSalle Auditorium, Cranbrook Museum of Art



Adult: Ready for a Brand New Beat: how "Dancing in the Street" became the anthem for a changing America by Mark Kurlansky — The summer of 1964 saw a new Motown hit that became not only an iconic song, but also an activist anthem in a time of great cultural change.

Teen: The Outsiders by S.E. Hinton — This classic coming-of-age novel set in the 1960s follows three brothers as they struggle to stay together and find their identities after their parents' death.
