The Library's Strategic Plan is Revealed

In December, the Library invited the community to view the newly refurbished study alcoves in the Youth Room. Trustee Judy Lindstrom thanked the community and library supporters for their generosity during our 50th anniversary year. It was funds raised during 2014, our 50th anniversary year that made the refurbishment possible.

These study alcoves feature comfortable furniture arranged in a way that encourages conversation and collaboration. Built during the 2008 library building renovation and expansion, they have been popular places for parents to read to children, for students to work on projects together, or for a quiet conversation between friends. Being popular can take its toll, and the spaces were in need of refreshing. When the 50th anniversary planning committee looked for a recipient of the funds raised in honor of the Library's anniversary, these alcoves were at the top of the list.



This growing need for collaborative space in the Bloomfield Township community follows a trend in libraries and schools across the country, a trend that is on our minds as the Library embarks on a new strategic plan. Last year, as part of



our strategic planning process, the Library asked the community for their thoughts on the library. We took all that input, threw in a lot of data, and sprinkled the whole mixture with some big-picture ideas, and cooked up a plan that will steer the library through the next five years. The plan has four broad areas of focus: customer service, marketing and fundraising, services and collections, and library spaces. 
