A Summer of Projects

In addition to creating the new space called The Commons, a few other building projects will be completed this year. A special thank you to our residents who voted for a 10-year millage in 2014. Money raised from that millage has allowed us to complete these vital projects.

Perhaps you've been in the Library during a rainstorm and know that our roof needs some attention. This summer, phase one of a two-phase roof rejuvenation project will begin. Phase two is scheduled to occur next year. This project will most likely cause some noise and temporary debris outside.

Another big project coming this summer is the installation of a new floor in the lobby. Current flooring has been much less durable than expected, and with heavy wear has become so degraded in spots that the sub-flooring is visible. New flooring will be installed in August. This project will be disruptive at times, and the library entrance will be affected. During renovations the following areas will be inaccessible: the Vending Café, vending machines, Library Shop, all Meeting Rooms (including the Community Room), and the restrooms near the Vending Café.

With all of the work scheduled throughout this summer, we aim to keep disruptions to a minimum. Please bear with us as we improve the Library!

Big Changes Happening @ the Library!

Over the past few years, it has become increasingly apparent that more seating is needed throughout the Library. During the Library's 2015 Strategic Planning process, patrons shared that they would like more space for working on projects, studying together, and gathering as a community. In response to this request, staff spent the past few years researching trends in library design and observing how our spaces are used.

What have we noticed? Every afternoon the Vending Café becomes very crowded and lacks seating for all who would like to use it. At certain times during the school year, we observe many students who are unable to find the kind of space they need to work together on projects and studying. During peak use times you can often find people sitting on the floor crowded around electricity outlets. It is our desire to address these needs of our patrons.

What have we learned? Libraries are evolving beyond books, and are becoming community gathering spaces. (Don't worry – books are still vital! They're not going anywhere.) An article published in the Oakland Press in March 2019 reported on ways public libraries are making changes to make them more appealing to non-traditional users. One area librarian stated, "Libraries are realizing that the very space they have is really important to the community."

What will we do? We are creating a new space called "The Commons." Our entire media collection has been moved into Adult and Youth Services, and the area where Media was will be reconfigured to offer more seating. Throughout the summer, different furniture models and layouts will be tested and evaluated. Your feedback is incredibly important, so we invite the community to visit the Library during this time to try out and evaluate the furniture. Please know that what you see during the summer will not be the end product. After thorough testing, this fall permanent furniture will be ordered, with the new space completed by the end of the year.

We are incredibly proud to provide our community with excellent services and collections housed in a beautiful building. We love to see so many people use the Library in so many different ways. We have listened, observed, researched, designed, and really thought about what will serve you best. It is our goal to continue to be "the place to discover" both great stories <u>and</u> great spaces.


