During the harsh winter months, utilizing the Library's free online eResources can be an excellent alternative to venturing out in bad weather. Discover the many digital offerings available right at your fingertips with your Bloomfield Township Public Library card or eCard by visiting www.btpl.org, including:

- The Library's **Downloads** section, which provides free online access to digital movies, television series, ebooks, music, and more. Many of these services offer downloadable apps, or are available through streaming devices such as Chromecast, Roku, and AppleTV.
- · Parents and students can utilize over 30 free eResources in Youth Databases by clicking on the Research tab of the Library's website. These include homework help, literacy and math sites for young children, foreign language learning, test prep, and live tutoring.
- · Found under the Research tab of the website, the Adult Databases section contains over 24 categories of digital resources, such as Consumer Protection, Genealogy, and Career Help, as well as free access to numerous online newspapers and magazines.
