LIBRARY CARD

Starting Monday, April 26, 2021, you will need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) to access your library card account.

Beginning Monday April 26, all library card holders will need to create their own PIN (Personal Identification Number) to access their library card account. The first time you log into your account after this change, you will receive a prompt to create a unique 4-digit PIN. The PIN must be four numerical digits of your choosing, with no letters or special characters.

Why is the Library instituting PINs?

Additional Security – The privacy of your library card account is a responsibility we take very seriously. This change will give you an additional level of protection. Similar to a password, your PIN number should be kept secret, because it allows access to your personal information, borrowed items, requested items, and any fines or fees owed.

Future Opportunities – This feature has become an industry standard. Making this change allows the Library to pursue new services and technology to better meet the needs of our community.

Convenience – If you know your library card number and PIN number by heart, you will no longer be required to have your physical library card to borrow items at the self-checkout machines.


