### What is The Washington Post?

The Washington Post is an American daily newspaper published in Washington, D.C. It is the most-widely circulated newspaper within the Washington metropolitan area, and has a large national audience.

Now, your Bloomfield Township Public Library card now allows you access to the Washington Post online. Here's how to start:

### Getting Started

#### Inside the library

- Connect to BTPL's WiFi network, named "Public."
- Visit [washingtonpost.com](http://washingtonpost.com).
- As long as you are inside the library and connected to the library's wifi, you will have unrestricted access to the Washington Post online.

That's it! You can now access all of the Washington Post online while connected to the library's WiFi, with no cap on number of articles viewed.

#### Outside of the library

- Visit [btpl.org/washingtonpost](http://btpl.org/washingtonpost) and click the blue "Click here to get started with the Washington Post outside the library" link.
- Enter your library card number and click "Login."
- Once you click "Login" you will have unrestricted access to the Washington Post online.
