All three bring impressive experience in areas such as finance, law, library operations, leadership, and project management. "The appointment process is competitive, and Shane, Joy, and Keith rose to the top of a pool of qualified and dedicated residents. I am thrilled to welcome them to the Library Board of Trustees," said Library Board President Joan Luksik.

Mr. Spradlin, Ms. Murray, and Dr. Carduner join three established Trustees on the Library Board.
