The Library's 2023-2025 Strategic Plan

To meet the emerging needs of the Bloomfield Township community, the Library underwent a strategic planning process in 2022. The goal of the process was to determine how best to utilize the Library's resources in delivering programs, providing outreach, and enhancing collections for meaningful community connection. Through focus groups, surveys, and stakeholder meetings, we asked for your vision of the kind of community you would like Bloomfield Township to be and what role the Library has in that vision. The Library Board of Trustees and staff pored through the resulting survey data and interview responses to develop an informed plan for the Library's future. We are excited to share our strategic direction and updated vision and mission statements that will guide the Library's priorities in the coming years.
