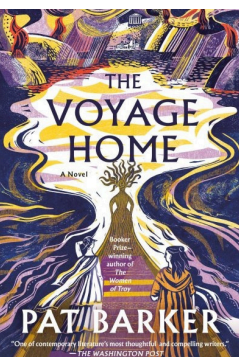
A struggling writer wakes up to find his date from the night before dead—and must then decide how far he's willing to go to spin the misadventure into his next big book.

Julia Armfield

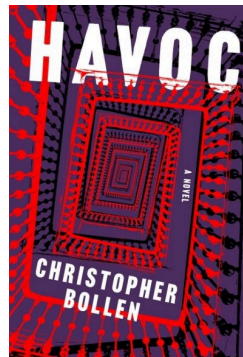
A speculative reimagining of King Lear, centering three sisters navigating queer love and loss in a drowning world.

Pat Barker

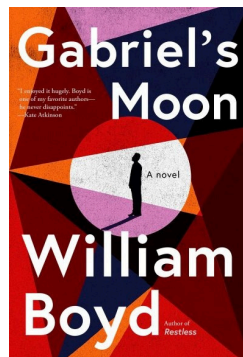
This brilliant reimagining of Greek mythology follows the young Ritsa and the Cassandra on their return journey to Mycenae.

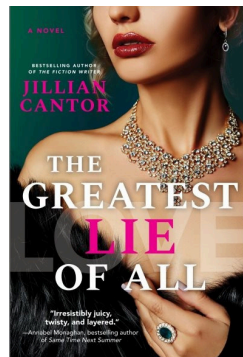
An atmospheric psychological suspense about a meddlesome elderly guest at a decadent luxury hotel.

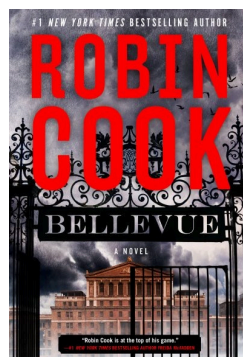
Gabriel is a travel writer during the Cold War. After an assignment in the Congo, he falls under the influence of an MI6 handler, and becomes her reluctant spy.

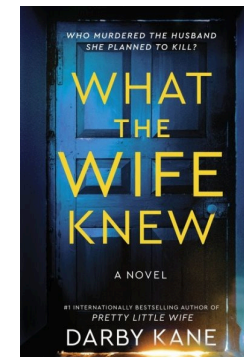

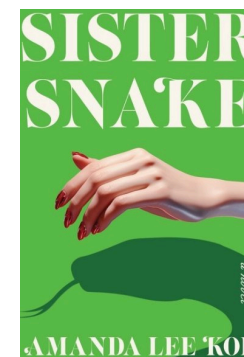
