Supporting Accessibility @ the Library

Bloomfield Township Public Library is committed to fostering a welcoming and inclusive environment. We understand that accessibility is essential in ensuring that all individuals regardless of their abilities can fully engage with the Library's services and resources. Youth Services' Accessibility Support Collection (ASC) is designed to meet the diverse needs of both children and families, providing tools and materials that enhance access to information, learning, and leisure. Whether you're seeking resources for vision or hearing support, learning differences, or mobility assistance, the ASC is here to support and empower all members of our community. Some features are:

- · Discovery Skills Kits for hands-on learning, which contain books, toys, games, and manipulatives focused on a specific concept or life skill.
- Adaptive toys with built-in capability switches, allowing easy manipulation with just a light touch for children with fine motor challenges.



Just a few of the many Accessibility Support Collection resources available at the Library: (from left to right) Discovery Skills Kits, Story Boxes, Signed Story Kits, and adaptive toys.

- Photo and illustrated cards that are designed to improve oral motor skills, fluency, and social skills, supporting speech and language development.
- Story Boxes for children with visual or language disabilities that include a picture book and manipulatives representing characters and items from the story.
- · Fiction stories that feature characters with disabilities, fostering self-identification and awareness, and non-fiction books that cover topics such as autism, Down syndrome, and learning disabilities, providing valuable resources for families and educators.
- · A Hi-Lo (high-interest, low-readability) collection that includes both fiction and non-fiction written at a lower reading level with topics that appeal to older readers.
- Signed Story Kits, which combine picture books and DVDs featuring a story told in American Sign Language (ASL).
- A collection of Braille books, Low Vision Books with high-contrast, simple illustrations, and a Large Print collection with popular chapter books for grades 2 – 8.
- Music and activity CDs and DVDs designed specifically for children with disabilities.
- · A Library Social Narrative, developed in partnership with the Autism Alliance of Michigan, that uses photographs and simple language to explain a visit to the Library.
- An Accessibility Support Technology Station, with a desktop PC that has adaptive software, large print keyboard, and a capability switch-optional trackball mouse.


