LIBRARY DESIGN PROJECT

This fall the Library will move forward with an interior design project to refresh its public spaces. The Library's last renovation was nearly 20 years ago, and while many areas remain relevant and well-used, others are no longer meeting the needs of the community. This exciting project is designed to improve high-traffic areas, transform underused spaces, and enhance the overall library experience by focusing on community and inclusivity.

Construction is expected to begin in the Youth Services and Circulation Desk areas in late August 2026. When completed, work will shift to the Adult and Teen Services area and Computer Center. The anticipated completion is late spring 2027.

Over the past 18 months, staff members and the Board of Trustees have been working alongside interior design partners C2AE and Reed Walker Design Collective to develop a plan that will benefit every library user. While construction will no doubt create some temporary inconveniences such as reduced programming, limited access to collections, and unavailable meeting rooms, we pledge to keep you fully informed of the project's progress at btpl.org/design and through the Library's social media pages. University of Michigan Museum of Natural History Workshop: "Feathered Dinosaurs and Modern Birds"*

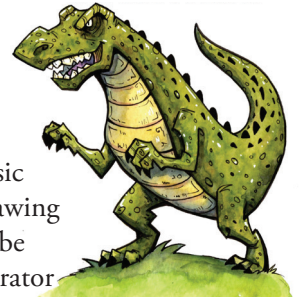
Wednesday, July 8, 5:30 p.m.

Make Your Own Dino Garden

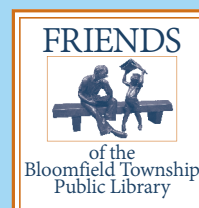

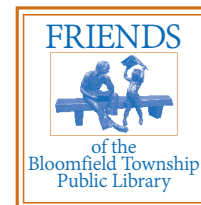
